A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

This past year has been an exciting year as we have experienced tremendous results from our programs around the world.

We have continued to expand our networking community of NGO's and this has enhanced our ability to have a greater impact with our limited resources. By finding NGO's with like vision and pooling our resources together in project areas the synergy affect is tremendous and we feel this is a major reason of our increased success. The quality of projects and enhanced services has created greater community support and involvement.

Our major sectors of involvement are: 1) Child survival projects; 2) providing education, clothing, food, and medical help to preschool and school age children; 3) health and nutritional training, community organization, micro-enterprise and sustainable gardening projects for parents of deprived children;

FMHC educational programs directly affect an increase in literacy among disadvantaged children, increased rate of school attendance, and positive impact in behavioral responses. School feeding programs increase attention span and comprehension levels. Evangelism outreaches increase knowledge of God and His plan for their lives.

FMHC recognizes the importance of skills development, small-scale entrepreneurship, and income generating programs, especially for women. It is generally recognized that women are most likely to shoulder the concerns for their family's food security. This is especially true in those countries ravaged by civil war where women are often the only surviving parent in the home.

The benefits of FMHC's services provide those necessities which are basic to all human development, and are successful in reaching the targeted beneficiaries by increasing the level of awareness on primary health care, family relationships, community participation, and by expanding the level of involvement for recipients in the various interventions.

FEED MY HUNGRY CHILDREN 2010 PROGRAMS

UNITED STATES

FMHC distributed 1,704,492 pounds of nutritious food with a value of \$2,556,738 to families with malnourished children through our 10 projects. We helped 34,090 families with over 1,311,148 meals.

The clientele consisted mostly of families with an average of 3 children per family. There are also many seniors who participate in this program. The food consisted of fresh vegetables, fruit and dry grocery products.

We continued to help provide **Water Barrels** with over 50 water barrels being distributed to families that have to haul their household water from as far as 20 miles away.

Also children's **Toys** were distributed to Native American children as well as to children from the inner city.

MEXICO

FMHC distributed 200,000 pounds of nutritious food with a value of \$300,000 to families with malnourished children through our 4 projects. We helped 4,000 families with over 153,846 meals.

The clientele consisted mostly of families with an average of 4 children per family. There are also many seniors who participate in this program. The food consisted of fresh vegetables, fruit and dry grocery products.

INNER-CITY PROGRAM:

FMHC's **Inner-city Program** is a bold outreach to the hurting or homeless people in the inner cities of America with the focus primarily on the lives of men and women who are released from jails or prisons, or the homeless living on the streets as well as poverty stricken families living in government subsidized housing.

We help support with. Hygiene products, clothing and shoes.

PHILIPPINES

Our support for our feeding projects were the main focus this last year as we helped provided nutritional meals to 1,000 needy children throughout the Philippines at 10 feeding centers.

Our medical outreaches serve the nearby poverty areas helping to meet the health needs of 2,152 people. The family planning programs our helping people to control the size of their families and have helped also in dealing with the many domestic family problems that lead to abusive households which result in financial strain on the families and communities.
